*Words of the Champions* is divided into three difficulty levels, ranked One Bee, Two Bee and Three Bee. At the beginning of each level, you’ll find the *School Spelling Bee Study List* words. For any classroom, grade-level or school spelling bee, study the 150-word One Bee *School Spelling Bee Study List*, the 150-word Two Bee *School Spelling Bee Study List* and the 150-word Three Bee *School Spelling Bee Study List*: a total of 450 words.

Following the *School Spelling Bee Study List* in each level, you’ll find pages marked “Words of the Champions.” Are you competing beyond the school level? Study these pages to make sure you’re prepared for the early rounds of competition. To help you engage with the words, you’ll find word stories and themed lists at the end of this guide.

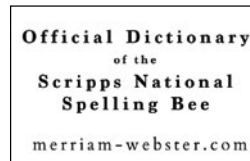

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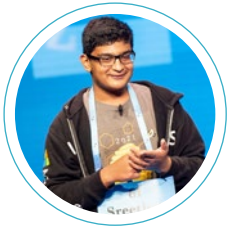

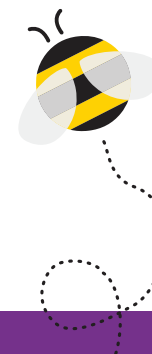

Why 1755? That was the year that the first really large and comprehensive dictionary was published in London by Samuel Johnson.

### piecing it together

Think about Dev Shah’s 2023 winning word: “psammophile”. The first part of this word contains the Greek root *psamm-* meaning “sand.” The second part of Dev’s word contains the Greek root *-phil* from the Greek word *philos* meaning “beloved, dear, loving.” Put that together and... can you guess what the word means?

### consonants 101

Not sure whether the word has one consonant or two? Check to see if the word has a suffix, such as a verb that has been conjugated. These words often – but not always! – have a doubled consonant before that suffix. “The speckled frog *hopped* off the log while the horse *plodded* down the lane and the train *chugged* down the tracks.” In each of these cases, the vowel before the doubled letter is a short sound. Can you spot others like this, and some that have long vowel sounds and do not double that consonant?

# word stories and themed lists



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Every word has a story, and the order of its letters often tells us something about the road that it traveled to get to us. Some words go back thousands of years to ancient languages like Greek and Latin and Sanskrit; others have their roots in literature and historical events; and others might only have been invented recently – as a trademark, online slang, or to refer to some new bit of technology. And all of these words are still growing and changing as our language evolves. A new word in your friend’s text message today might end up catching on and becoming a part of English! And years down the road, lexicographers will be hunting for the story of exactly how those letters came together to form a new word.

We asked some former spellers (featured on page 4) to tell us which words in this year’s edition of *Words of the Champions* had interesting stories. Here are some of the words they told us about.



# Rubicon

found in the two bee list



## Definition:

a bounding or limiting line; especially : one that when crossed commits a person to an irrevocable change or decision.

## Origin:

This word is from a Latin name for an Italian river.

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The word “Rubicon” has been defined as a line that one crosses when making irrevocable decisions. The word “Rubicon” originates from the Latin word “rubeus,” meaning “red.” This name was used for the Rubicon River in Italy, whose waters were reddish because of iron deposits. The connection between this river and irrevocable decisions requires us to go back more than 2,000 years.

The Rubicon River became famous in 49 B.C.E. At that time, there were increasing political tensions between the Senate and Julius Caesar, who was leading an army in Gaul. Following many successful conquests, the Senate ordered Caesar to disband his army and return to Rome not as a military leader but as a private citizen. As he faced the possibility of losing all of his power, Caesar decided to cross the Rubicon, violating a Roman law that forbid generals from bringing armies into a part of Italy not directly controlled by the Roman Empire. As he crossed the river, Caesar said, “The die is cast,” highlighting the point of no return – as everyone knows, even in board games, once you roll a die or a set of dice, you have to accept the consequences.

Caesar’s act has forever linked the river’s name with bold, irreversible decisions. His decision would begin a three-year civil war in which he would overthrow Pompey and become the sole leader of the Roman world.

# saccharide

found in the three bee list



## Definition:

a simple sugar, combination of sugars, or polymerized sugar.

## Origin:

This word is formed from an originally Sanskrit element that went from Pali to Greek to Latin plus a French-derived element.

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The word saccharide has an unassuming etymology of the parts sacchar- and -ide, which Merriam-Webster says are drawn from “International Scientific Vocabulary.” You may have seen the root -ide in many chemical words before, but where does sacchar- come from? It is a story of linguistic and cultural evolution that begins with the ancient Sanskrit word “sarkara,” meaning pebble.

When crystallized sugar was first produced from sugarcane in India sometime around the third century A.D., it resembled small pebbles, leading “sarkara” to be the first word for what we know as sugar.

This word then began a fascinating journey, going through Persian as “shakar,” then into Arabic, moving through Italian, Latin, and French, and finally becoming “sugar” in English. This progression reflects both the linguistic changes that occur as a word travels through languages and the historical spread of sugar production methods from India through Persia and the Middle East to Europe.

For the word “saccharide,” the path was more direct. The Sanskrit “sarkara” passed into Greek as “sakcharon” and then into Latin as “saccharum.” People everywhere love sweet things, so this word has spread far and fast!

# shazam

found in the two bee list

## Definition:

used to indicate an instantaneous transformation or appearance.

## Origin:

This word is an acronym formed from several names and was originally used in a comic strip.



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This word's etymology describes it as an acronym – a word formed from the first letter of several other words. But unlike abbreviations like NATO and FBI (or BTW and TTYL), it's not instantly clear what words form the acronym of shazam! This word actually originates from a DC Comics strip on Captain Marvel that first appeared in late 1939. Young Billy Batson receives his powers from an old wizard named Shazam, who draws on the power of six gods and heroes, one drawn from the Old Testament of the Bible and the others from Greek mythology and epic poetry. S stands for the wisdom of Solomon; H, the strength of Hercules; A, the stamina of Atlas; Z, the power of Zeus; A, the courage of Achilles; and M, the speed of Mercury. So with the wizard's help, Billy Batson only needs to shout "shazam!" to turn into the superhero Captain Marvel.

Today, this isn't just Captain Marvel's word anymore. We might say it after discovering the solution to a tricky chemistry problem, adding the perfect ingredient to a recipe, or witnessing an unexpectedly brilliant DIY project come to life - anytime we want to describe an awesome, almost superhuman transformation!

# tase

found in the one bee list

## Definition:

to shoot (someone) with a gun that fires electrified darts to stun and immobilize a person.

## Origin:

This word is formed from a word that is a trademark.

This word's origin describes it as being formed from another trademark - specifically, it is the verb that describes the use of the noun "taser." We know tasers today largely due to their use by law enforcement. But how did their name come about? And why is it spelled in this particular way?

The taser was created by American inventor Jack Cover in the mid 1970s. Cover's favorite childhood books were the Tom Swift books about an inventor of amazing gadgets, and when he made his own invention, he named it after those books. (The language game known as the "Tom Swifty" also comes from the dialogue style of these books, by the way!) The word "taser" is an acronym that stands for "Tom A. Swift Electric Rifle." It was introduced to law enforcement in the 1990s, and became a commonly used trademark soon after that.

# witch of Agnesi

found in the three bee list

## Definition:

a plane cubic curve that is symmetric about the y-axis and approaches the x-axis as an asymptote, that is constructed by drawing lines from the origin intersecting an upright circle tangent to the x-axis at the origin and taking the locus of points of intersection of pairs of lines parallel to the x-axis and y-axis, and that has the equation  $x^2y = 4a^2(2a - y)$ .

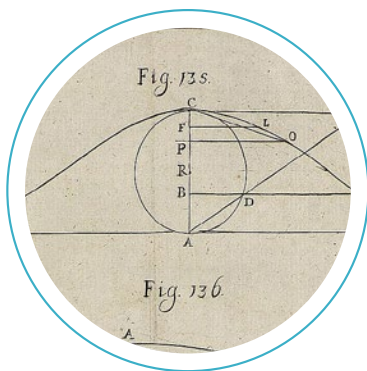
## Origin:

This word entry consists of originally English words plus an Italian name.

The witch of Agnesi looks like a historical or mythological word, but it's actually a type of mathematical curve – and its name in English is actually based on a mistake! The curve itself was studied as early as 1653 by Pierre de Fermat and later was studied by Guido Grandi and Isaac Newton in 1703. In 1748, female mathematician Maria Gaetana Agnesi published a calculus textbook including her study of the curve.

Agnesi named the curve “la versiera di Agnesi” (as versiera is Italian for “that-which-turns”, coming from Latin *vertere* meaning “to turn”). However, English math professor John Colson read the name of the curve as “l'avversiera di Agnesi.” “L'avversiera” translates roughly to “woman who is against God,” a term which, in that time period, was synonymous with the word “witch.” Thus, the curve's name in English became the witch of Agnesi.

Despite her accomplishments – and the mistaken association of her name with the dark arts – Maria Gaetana Agnesi abandoned her mathematical studies after the death of her father in 1752, and dedicated the last forty years of her life to prayer and charitable work.



# Bavarian cream

found in the two bee list

## Definition:

a dessert of a flavored whipped gelatine mixture into which whipped cream is folded.

## Origin:

The first part of this word entry is from a German place name plus an English element, and the second part went from Latin to French to English.



Chances are, if you walk into your local donut shop, you'll be able to find a Bavarian cream donut. In fact, at Dunkin', you can find not one but three different varieties with different kinds of toppings and icing. The Bavarian cream you find in donuts is a little different from the original, often mixed with whipped cream for a smoother texture, since the original is a custard-like dessert.

To understand this name, you need to know a little history and a little geography. First, Bavaria is in the southern part of modern-day Germany, but for many centuries it was its own princely state. This state was ruled for many centuries by the House of Wittelsbach, a German noble family, but the people who cooked in their kitchens were often French. It was these French chefs who developed Bavarian cream in the 17th and 18th centuries by creating a dessert of milk thickened with eggs. Soon, this cream was spreading across the continent – the French call it “bavarois” and the Italians call it “bavarese,” and all of these cultures started experimenting with this delicious new element.

Today, Bavarian cream is typically stabilized with gelatin so it can hold its shape when refrigerated--which is the reason you can often find it in restaurants in elegant molds. Though it was traditionally served as a custard with a fruit puree or fruit sauce, you now often find it in other forms such as pastry fillings, like in a Boston cream pie or donut.



# Nostradamus

found in the two bee list



**Definition:**

one professing to foretell future events.

**Origin:**

This word is from a French name.

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The French astrologer, apothecary, physician, and seer Michel de Nostradame, who claimed to be a prophet, has always had both detractors and true believers – he is usually referred to by the Latinized form of his name, Nostradamus.

First known for his unusual medical treatments of people suffering from the Plague, Nostradamus began to make prophecies in 1547. In 1555, he published the book with 942 four-line poems allegedly telling the future – a book that is sometimes called *Centuries* because the poems are grouped into sets of one hundred. An enlarged second edition of predictions appeared in 1558.

Some of Nostradamus' predictions were thought to have come true in his lifetime, and he became so famous that he was invited to the court of Catherine de' Medici, who was married to the King Henry II of France.

Even in his lifetime, though, his prophecies were the source of much controversy – as they still are. Because Nostradamus' predictions are vague, people have attached them to a number of historical events that have already occurred (this is called postdiction or retroactive clairvoyance) to try and justify his reputation as a seer. Some events attributed to Nostradamus include the French Revolution, the rise of Hitler, and even the COVID-19 pandemic!

Today, we use his name to describe anyone who professes to tell future events. Although, given that Nostradamus also believed the world would end on July 4th, 1999, perhaps we shouldn't give him too much credit!

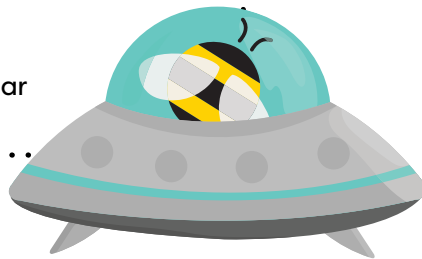

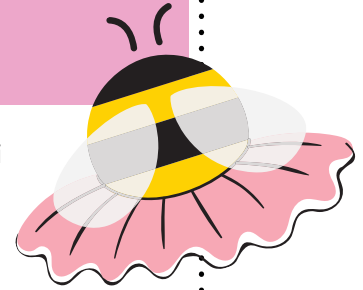
